# 3/03 <u>Occupational Pension Schemes (Internal Disputes Resolution</u> Procedures) Regulation 1996 – Firemen's Pension Scheme

The Committee considered a disagreement registered by Leading Firefighter B regarding a decision made by the Chief Fire Officer under Section 50(2)(a) of the Pensions Act 1995. The appeal related to the treatment of the long service increment, introduced as part of the firefighters' pay award, as pensionable pay.

After considering the submissions from both parties, the Committee accepted the view of the Chief Fire Officer that, since the issue in question formed part of the nationally agreed settlement, the Authority had no discretion as to the treatment of the increment.
