1. 2009 ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF STANDARDS COMMITTEES

2. **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

2.1 The purpose of the report is to inform members of the 2009 Assembly of Standards Committees which took place on 12th and 13th October 2009.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The 2009 Annual Assembly of Standards Committees took place on 12th and 13th October 2009. It provided a forum for sharing good practice examples, talking through the experiences of managing the practicalities of the local standards framework and looking at strategic issues such as leadership.
- 3.2 The Assembly was attended by the independent Chair of the Standards Committee and the Monitoring Officer.
- 3.3 The Monitoring Officer was a member of the expert steering committee of standards committee members and officers that developed the programme for the Assembly. She was also a presenter at one of the Assembly sessions, "Sharing Good Practice: Monitoring Officers". This was attended by about 80-100 people. The Monitoring Officer drew upon the practices of the West Midlands Fire and Rescue Authority and in particular of Sandwell Council where she is also the Monitoring Officer.

- 3.4 The Assembly included plenary sessions, workshops and discussion forums covering a range of relevant topics.
- 3.5 The Standards Committee will be addressed by the independent chair of the Standards Committee to further share experiences and learning.
