17/14 <u>Minutes</u>

In respect of Minute No. 16/14 (Proposed High Speed (HS) Rail 2 Route – Update 2), the Deputy Chief Fire Officer updated members on the developments with HS2 negotiations.

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19/14 Planned Procurement Exercise for 2015/16 – Provision of a Hydraulic Platform Vehicle

In accordance with Standing Order 1/8 of the Authority's Procurement Procedures, approval was sought to proceed with a tender exercise for the provision of a Hydraulic Platform Vehicle.

Whilst the total contract value was above the Official Journal of the European Union (OJEU) threshold for Supply, it was proposed that the contract would be let by way of direct award using The Consortium Framework for Specialist Vehicles. There was only one supplier on the Framework for this product and that company had offered to hold the current price if an order was placed by 18 December, 2014. This would achieve a saving of approximately £35,000. The vehicle offered would be the same specification as the current fleet of operational hydraulic platforms alleviating the need for additional training for firefighters, transport engineering workshops' technicians and consolidating maintenance and repair costs.

Members were also informed that the specification for the vehicle was a Volvo chassis, with Bronto bodywork and lift reaching 32 metres.

Resolved that approval be given to proceed with the tender exercise for the provision of a Hydraulic Platform Vehicle during 2015/16.
